
STEP 1: To create an FSA ID, you must log on to fsaid.ed.gov


Your FSA ID will replace your PIN as the way to confirm your identity when accessing your financial aid information through certain ED websites. When logging in to these websites, you will be required to enter only your FSA ID username and password. Once you visit the website, you will see the screen below. Enter all required identity information.

STEP 2: Once the identity information has been provided, you will be asked to enter your FSA PIN number in order to link PIN to your FSA identity.

If you already have a PIN, you can link your information to your new FSA ID by entering your PIN while registering for your FSA ID. (This will save you time when registering for your FSA ID.) If you've forgotten your PIN, don't worry; you can either enter the answer to your PIN "challenge question" during the FSA ID registration process to link your PIN, or you can just create your FSA ID from scratch. A PIN is not required to create an FSA ID but may delay the time at which your FSA ID may be verified and used.



STEP 3: Next, you will be asked to provide personal information such as your SSN, DOB, and Full Legal Name.



PLEASE NOTE: Your username does not expire, but your FSA ID password will expire every 18 months unless you change it. Your FSA ID password is not the same as the former FAFSA password, which is now known as the Save Key.

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STEP 5: This step will require you to answer your security questions in case you forget your login information. Two questions you may select specified options and two other questions you will create.




STEP 6: Once you have completed your security questions, you will be sent a secure code to the email you have provided in your profile information. This will verify your email account.

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STEP 7: Next, you will certify that you have read and accept the terms and conditions of creating the FSA ID. *And Viola!* You have successfully created your FSA ID.



Parents of student financial aid applicants must create their own FSA ID as well and can apply for an FSA ID at any time. If you don't have one by the time you enter any of the sites that require it, you will be prompted to apply for one. However, if you think the Social Security Administration (SSA) might have the wrong name or date of birth for you in its records, go to www.ssa.gov now to find out how to correct any errors. Your information must be correct with the SSA before your FAFSA or FSA ID can be processed. FSA IDs are required when accessing the following websites:
