Media Center Rules – Students

- 1. Students are encouraged to use the media center for research, technology use, leisure reading, curricular reinforcement activities, group projects, and study purposes. Students may work as individuals or as a group as long as a quiet and productive environment is maintained.
- 2. Students may use the media center laptops according to availability. The equipment must remain in the designated placement area, be used solely for school-related purposes, and be used in a manner consistent with common-acceptable use. Misuse such as vandalism, theft or tampering will result in restitution, office referral, or loss of library privileges.
- 3. Students may check out books provided no library fees (late fees or fines for lost books) are outstanding. The checkout period is 3 weeks; after that a fine will be assessed at the rate of \$.10/day/book. (See Marathon Middle/High School Library Fines Policy for more information.)
- 4. Disruptive students will be asked to stop the disruptive behaviors. If the behaviors continue, the student will be asked to return to the classroom. If a pattern of disruptive behaviors develops or the behavior is egregious, the student will be barred from the library for a period of time varying from 1 hour to 1 semester depending upon the severity and the history of the behaviors.
- 5. No food or drinks other than water are permitted in the media center.
- 6. Students are expected to follow reasonable requests of teachers, staff, and other authorities.
