

SPECIFYING THE REASON FOR YOUR ABSENCE.



needs to be successful.





If you are ever wondering what I do as a school counselor here are a few things I do to support children and families.

- Work with ALL students to encourage a safe school climate of trust and respect.
- Deliver classroom lessons. For example; Safer Smarter Kids curriculum and SEL, Friendship, Social Skills, Character Education and Team Building lessons.
- Facilitate small groups.
- Meet individually with students to do brief solution focused counseling.
- Collaborate with parents/guardians, teachers, support staff, and administration.
- Maintain confidentiality of student and their families unless there is a need to know or safety concern.
- Implement PBIS program (Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports).
- Provide information on community resources.

What is PBIS?

Creates and maintains a safe and effective learning environment.

Ensures all students have social skills needed for success at school and beyond.

Provides a proactive system-wide framework for implementation.

Improves academic performance.

Reduces bullying behaviors.

Improves social-emotional competence.

Reduces off ice discipline referrals and suspensions.

Improves teacher outcomes, including perception of teacher efficacy; school organizational health and school climate, and school safety.
