 - a. Elections – we are always looking for Parent Participation on our SAC Board; we want to continue the strides we made last year with parent involvement
 - i. September elections at the next SAC meeting; If interested reach out to Principal Alsobrooks
 - b. SIP Plan
 - i. Due to the District Aug 1; Plan was approved by the District and now presented to SAC for parent input
 - ii. Describes our goals for the year and strategies for the year
 - iii. Focus on our Mission and Vision statement this school year
 - iv. Leadership team includes Principal Alsobrooks, AP Steve Vinson, Lit Coaches, and more
 - v. RAISE School with 79% FRL status
 - vi. ATSI school – subgroup performing below 41% proficiency; our ESE group making steady increases
 - vii. 'C' School – increased 7% from 2223 SY

- viii. Goal 1 – Students with Disabilities increasing proficiency by ensuring our teachers are focusing on small group instruction strategies; focusing on ELA based on data and meeting needs in classrooms
- ix. Goal 2 – ELA proficiency K-5; K-2 emphasis on program called UFly and 3-5 utilizing Amira (AI based program that interacts with students; 1-on-1 tutor program that builds as the student progresses)
- x. Targeting students based on PM 1 Data – identify students, strategize and then monitor throughout the year for improvement
- xi. Goal 3 - Math Manipulatives to focus on word problems
- xii. Goal 4 – Decrease number of chronically absent students from 17% to 10%
- xiii. Parent input
 - 1. Parent had questions regarding ESE students/goals

c. Leader In Me

- i. 7 Habits of Highly Effective People – program that helps students take ownership over actions and build strong success skills
- ii. Teachers participated in two-day training to prepare for implementation during the school year
- iii. Classroom lessons to teach students and Staff using Leader In Me centric verbiage to reinforce concepts
- iv. Leader of the Month program – School Counselor Mrs. Orcutt recognizing exemplar students to build confidence and encourage positive habits

d. Schedule changes from last year

- i. Teachers now have 50-minute planning period which impacts drop off – 7:30 AM doors open (different than last year at 7:15); Breakfast available and FREE; 7:45 morning mile; gate closing at 8:05 AM; Students considered TARDY after 8:05 and will need to go through the Front Office
- ii. Dismissal – lower grades at 2:45 and upper grades

- e. Morning drop off – it would be nice to see more staff members in the loop at drop off IF POSSIBLE
 - i. Pre K/VPK drop off a little chaotic – Parents have to park and sign in students; once bussing for Head Start is situated this will calm down
 - ii. Parent messaging will be sent out to hopefully aid parents in following proper drop-off protocol
 - iii. Parent suggestion: 5-minute temporary parking spots; Principal Alsobrooks will follow up with SRO Salter to work out potential solutions
 - iv. Staff members are union contracted; VPK staff has grant regulations (i.e. ratios) prohibiting them being able to join in drop-off
 - v. GAE Parents are able to park in far lot of CFK next door and walk students over
 - vi. Parent suggestions always welcome!
- f. Fundraiser – Penny Wars (we would challenge each grade to bring in pennies to go towards something (whatever you feel is most needed) and whichever grade collects the most we could do a pizza/popsicle party for)
 - i. Grades competing against each other and grade with most pennies raised gets a prize
 - ii. Principal Alsobrooks suggested profits go to Student Activities or school's Needy Children's Fund
 - iii. S. Yoest/SAC Parents will assemble flyer, make fundraising request, organize penny counting and jars for students
 - iv. Board to monitor and show grade levels progress
 - v. Timeline suggestion – Red Ribbon Week; Principal Alsobrooks will finalize dates with planning team leaders
- g. College Colors Day – next Friday, 8/30
 - i. Communications for all events will be shared in advance for parents to prepare
