





### Monroe County School-Based Dental Sealant & Fluoride Varnish Program for 2nd & 7th Grade Students

### Your child will receive:

- Dental assessment
- · Education on how to properly brush his/her teeth
- · Dental sealants (if needed)
- Fluoride varnish
- · Toothbrush, toothpaste, and floss
- · Referrals for follow-up care (if needed)
- A licensed Florida dental hygienist will provide these preventive dental services.
- Your child will not be given any shots, medicine, x-rays, or fillings.
- After your child has been seen, a letter will be sent to your home explaining the services your child received and the follow-up care needed.
- You will not receive a bill. This program is at no out of pocket cost to you. If your child is covered by Medicaid, the dental services we provide will be billed to Medicaid. Any services not covered by Medicaid are at no cost to you.

For your child to receive these services you need to: Complete every question on the form

Return to your child's homeroom teacher tomorrow!
