



HORACE O'BRYANT SCHOOL REQUIRED UNIFORM/DRESS CODE 2023-2024

HOB Logo Shirts – Students must wear the approved HOB logo school shirts only. These are available at the HOB front office. The cost is \$13.00 for short sleeve t-shirts and \$16 for dry-fit short sleeve.

Students may wear:

- HOB shirt or Sweatshirt
- Plain shirt or Sweatshirt/sweater
- · Any Key West school/sport/club related shirt on Fridays
- Appropriate shorts/pants
 - a. No undergarments visible
 - b. No spandex/bike shorts
 - c. No butt cheeks showing while in any position
- Leggings with a long shirt covering the buttocks

Jackets – HOB logo jackets are available at Ramona's Conch Creations for \$30.00 These are the **only** allowed jackets at HOB or plain colored jackets. The classrooms can be cold even in the fall and spring months, so please purchase your jacket early in the year. Hoods may not be worn on the head while in the buildings.

Shoes –Shoes must be worn at all times on campus. Tennis shoes or sneakers must be worn for Physical Education classes. For <u>all</u> students, tennis shoes or flat-bottomed shoes <u>with back straps</u> must be worn to school for safety on the playground and staircases. House or bedroom slippers, slip-on sports sandals, or skate shoes are not an acceptable shoe for school.

Organization Shirts/Dress-down Days – Elementary class shirts, Student Council, Band, NJHS, AVID, and athletic/cheer/dance team members may wear organizational shirts on specified days or events only. On occasion the principal will allow a PBIS dress-down day when students may wear clothing other than the prescribed uniform. This will be on special occasions only and the dress code will still need to be adhered to (no sleeveless, backless or midriff-showing tops, correct length of bottoms, etc). The students and/or parents will be notified.

Backpacks/book bags/purses – students may bring backpacks/book bags to school but must remove books and supplies in the morning before homeroom and store them in their locker or cubie along with their cell phones, air pods, and any other electronic devices. Students may not use a backpack/book bag during the day. After school, students may place books and supplies in their backpacks/book bags to carry home.

Note: Students who fail to comply with the Uniform/Dress Code Policy shall be advised of the policy and offered the use of a clean shirt or bottoms for the day. The school shall attempt to contact the student's parents. Students who repeatedly fail to dress in accordance with the Uniform/Dress Code Policy may be subject to disciplinary actions as set forth in the HOB Student/Parent Guide. The Administration reserves the right to judge what is appropriate or not. 2023-2024 HOB K-5 Supply Lists - listed below are the basic school supplies needed to start the school year.
