A sniffle? A cough? A sore throat? Children come down with illnesses big and small. Some are contagious, some are not. How do you know when to keep your child home from school? For the safety of all of our students and staff, please keep students at home for any of the following reasons:

- Fever >99.9* prior to medication- if students are medicated for a fever, they should not be in school until they are fever free for 24 hours
- Diarrhea- keep child home until stool is formed.
- Vomiting- keep child home until they have not vomited for 24 hours.
- Severe Cough and Cold- keep child home with a serious cough. It can be contagious to others
- Nasal Discharge- keep child home with green nasal discharge. It is a clear sign of a sinus infection and can be passed easily from student to student when sick child rubs their nose.
- Sore Throat- can be a sign of strep or a common cold. Keep child at home for at least 24 hours if they have been diagnosed with strep throat. They must be on antibiotics for 24 hours prior to returning to school.
- Pinkeye- keep child home for 24 hours after treatment has been started. Highly contagious!!!! Symptoms include eye redness, irritation, swelling, and pus.
- Fatigue- keep child home if they are not acting like the bubbly, happy child they are and seem overly exhausted doing simple activities.

*** If medication has been prescribed by a physician for any kind of infection, students should not return to school until at least 24 hours after the medication has been taken to be sure they are not contagious. ***

***<u>ALL</u> medications, including over the counter medications, are required to have a doctor's prescription and must be signed in through the clinic by a parent or guardian. Students are not permitted to carry any medications during school unless cleared through the clinic staff and principal. Please call the clinic staff if you have any questions or concerns. Thank you ***



The Mission of MCCOAD

The mission of Monroe County Community Organizations Active in Disaster (MCCOAD) is to coordinate effective, efficient, and streamlined service delivery to people affected by disaster, while eliminating unnecessary duplication of effort, through the four phases of a disaster: preparation, response, recovery, and mitigation.

What does a COAD do?

The Monroe County COAD is a forum where organizations share knowledge and resources throughout the disaster cycle to better assist disaster survivors and their unmet needs. The MCCOAD's role is to bring member organizations together with local Emergency Management personnel & enable them to understand each other & work together during the four phases of Emergency Management: MITIGATION & PREPAREDNESS, RESPONSE, & RECOVERY.

Four Phases of Partnership

- Mitigation and Preparedness: Community education and preparedness, recruiting volunteers and donations, organizing and training volunteers, resource inventory of private, non-profit, and faith-based organizations.
- Response: Volunteer and donation management, shelter workers and respite centers, volunteer generation, damage assessment/needs identification, muck-out and clean up crews, comprehensive situational awareness, individual assistance services.
 - Recovery: Short-term and long-term recovery committee, case management, rebuilding, financial support.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Monroe County Community Organizations Active in Disaster (COAD) are encouraging all Hurricane Ian survivors to apply for FEMA assistance. Survivors are eligible to receive up to \$75,800 from FEMA to pay for temporary housing, emergency home repairs, personal property losses not covered by insurance, and medical expenses caused by the declared disaster.

To apply for FEMA:

- 1. Visit www.DisasterAssistance.gov or download the FEMA App for mobile devices.
- Call toll-free 800-621-3362 between 7:00am and 11:00pm. Multiple languages, including English, Spanish, and Creole, are available.
- In-person by visiting the FEMA Mobile Registration Intake Center (MRIC) between 8:00am and 6:00pm at the below dates and locations:

10/22-10/28 at the Nelson English Park, 1127 Thomas Street, Key West 10/29-11/2 at Bernstein Park, 6751 5th Street, Stock Island 11/4-11/5 at the Nelson Government Center, 102050 Overseas Hwy, Key Largo

To submit a FEMA claim, survivors will need their Social Security number or identification card, insurance information, damage information, household income, and contact information.

The deadline to apply for FEMA assistance is November 28, 2022.

Who is Eligible to Apply for FEMA:

U.S. citizens, non-citizen nationals, and qualified aliens are eligible to apply for FEMA assistance (see below for definitions of non-citizen national and qualified aliens). Survivors who are not U.S. citizens, non-citizen nationals, or qualified aliens may still apply for FEMA assistance if:

- Another adult member in the household meets the eligibility criteria and certifies their citizenship status during the registration process or signs the Declaration and Release form, or
- 2) The parent or guardian of a minor child who is a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national or a qualified alien applies for assistance on behalf of the child, if they live in the same household. The parent or legal guardian must register as the co-applicant, and the minor child must be under age 18 at the time the disaster occurred.

Non-citizen Nationals include:

- A person born in an outlying possession of the U.S. (e.g., American Samoa) on or after the date the U.S. acquired the possession.
- A person whose parents are U.S. non-citizen nationals.

Oualified aliens include:

- A legal permanent resident ("green card" holder).
- An asylee, refugee or an alien whose deportation is being withheld.
- An alien paroled into the U.S. for at least one year.
- An alien granted conditional entry (per law in effect prior to April 1, 1980).
- A Cuban or Haitian entrant.
- Certain aliens subjected to extreme cruelty or who have been a victim of a severe form of human trafficking, including persons with a "T" or "U" visa.
- Aliens whose children have been abused and alien children whose parent has been abused who fit certain criteria.

Parents/Guardians of Qualified Minor Children:

- The parent or guardian of a minor child living in the same household may apply for assistance on behalf of the minor child who is a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien.
- The minor child must be under age 18 as of the first day of the incident period, Sept. 23, 2022.

If you're unsure of your immigration status, talk to an immigration expert to learn if your status falls within the immigration status requirements for FEMA disaster assistance.

To appeal a FEMA Decision:

FEMA decisions can be appealed by calling 800-621-3362 or by visiting the FEMA Mobile Registration Intake Center (MRIC) at the dates and locations specified above.

Reminder: FEMA disaster assistance is intended to help survivors pay for basic necessities lost because of Hurricane lan, and the money must be used for that purpose. Those receiving assistance are urged to keep receipts for their disaster spending for three years to document the money was used to meet disaster-related expenses. If applicants spend the payment on anything other than the purpose for which it is intended, they may be denied future disaster assistance. In some cases, FEMA may ask that the money be returned.
