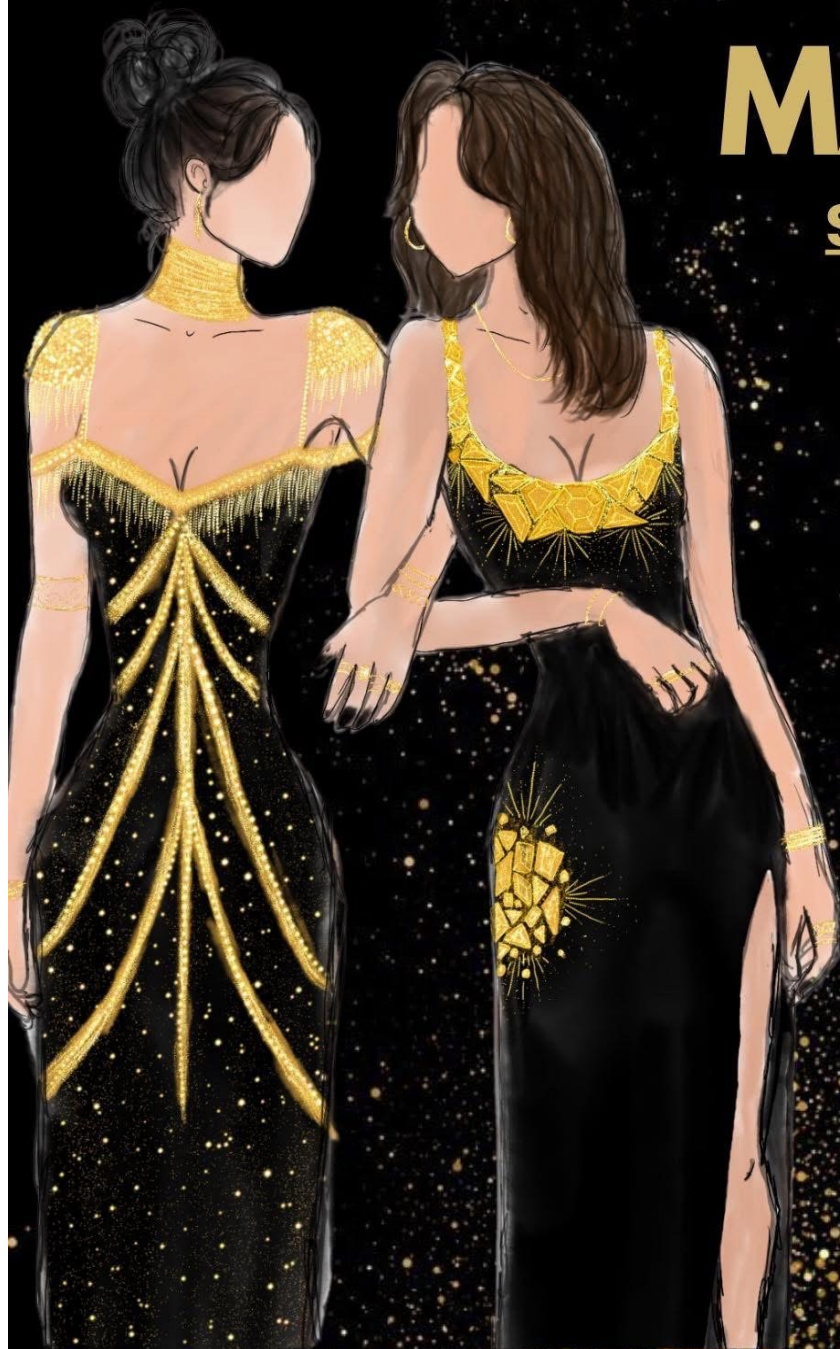

They are free checking accounts with Conch debit cards help raise money up to \$1,000 per month for Key West High School. Keys FCU donates:

\$5 to [KWHS for each account opened](#).

- \$2 to KWHS for each box of checks ordered.
- 1% of each account holder's debit card transactions, up to \$15 per month to KWHS during specific promotional periods like Back to School, Spring Break and Christmas season.

Conch Pride accounts include free adult and teen online & mobile financial education programs that teach them how to save and manage their checking account and credit history and more.

Who can get a Conch Pride Checking Account?

Conch Pride Checking Accounts and Debit Cards are perfect for KWHS students- 14 years and older, parents, teachers, staff, alumni, and fans-that live or work in the Florida Keys.

Where can you open a Conch Pride account?

In Keys Federal Credit Union at 3022 N. Roosevelt Blvd. in Key Plaza, 514 Southard St., and 5300 Overseas Hwy. in Stock Island.

How can KWHS raise more money?

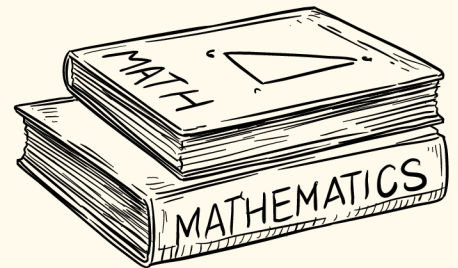

A Guide to Class of 2025 Senior Week

Senior Week is a memorable week of events to recognize student achievement, perseverance, and success leading up to the ultimate recognition of Graduation. The sequence of events allows students, parents, and staff to reflect, remember, and enjoy their Key West High journey in preparation of moving on to the next chapter of their lives. We hope that you can join us for all of the following events.

Senior Banquet – Thursday, May 22nd 6:00pm in cafeteria---7:00pm in the auditorium

These are awards given by teachers, coaches, and sponsors for student involvement and achievement. Many students, including ones who do not expect it, receive some sort of recognition. You will eat first in the cafeteria (food provided by your executive board) and then head over to the auditorium for the ceremony. Seniors will sit in the front center section of the auditorium. Majority of these awards are pins that you will put on your gown when you receive it. Dress is banquet attire

Investitures practice – Friday, May 23rd 8:00am in the auditorium

Investitures practice is MANDATORY for all seniors participating in any graduation ceremony. Students will fill out exit slips from Mrs. Estenoz which are a quick little survey of your plans after high school, then you will receive index cards where you will put who you want for Prom King & Queen on one side of the card and then put who you want to be the recipient of the Balfour Award (did the most for the class) on the other side of the card. We will then go over procedures for the week, practice walking in the auditorium and get your caps and gowns. CAPS AND GOWNS WILL NOT BE GIVEN UNLESS ALL CREDITS ARE EARNED AND CLEARED FROM DEBT LIST (school books, sports uniforms, library books, graduation fees). Girls may want to bring their graduation shoes so they can practice walking in them. Dress is comfortable casual

Investitures – Friday, May 23rd 7:00pm in the auditorium

Investitures is the ceremony in which students are officially qualified for graduation. This is the first time they will wear their caps and gowns. Please remember what to wear underneath the gown: Girls-white dress or pants outfit (no print) and white shoes (heels, wedges, pretty sandals, Birkenstocks if needed). Boys-white button up shirt (short or long sleeve), black pants, black tie and black shoes. In addition to qualifying students as candidates for graduation, this night recognizes student leadership in major clubs (NHS, Beta, Z Club, Mu Alpha Theta, Student Council, Interact, and Executive Board). Pins, chords and stoles will be handed to you by the newly elected officers of that club. The Valedictorian and Salutatorian of the class are announced. Dress is cap and gowns with appropriate clothing underneath.

Baccalaureate – Sunday, May 25th at 10:30am for St. Mary's Church, 11:00am for Fifth St Baptist Church, and 12:30 for Trinity Presbyterian Church

Baccalaureate is a religious service held at local churches in recognition and prayer for our graduates. Though not a school sponsored event, we just pass on the information so that students may participate if they so choose. St Mary's holding service at 10:30am, Fifth Street Baptist will hold a service at 11:00am and Trinity Presbyterian Church will hold a service at 12:30pm. Graduates are welcome to participate in either service regardless of church membership. Dress is Cap and Gown with the appropriate attire underneath.

Senior Prom – Tuesday, May 27th 7:00pm—10:00pm at the Southernmost House

This year's Senior Prom is at the Southernmost House. This theme is Once Upon A Time. This is for seniors and one guest if they elect to take one. All guests can be a freshmen, sophomore, or junior. If you are bringing an underclassmen, they MUST arrive with you. There is no dress code, however please wear appropriate attire.

Class Night – Wednesday, May 28th 6:00pm in the auditorium

Class Night is a special night of impressive generosity. Hundreds of thousands of dollars are presented to worthy recipients, all of whom are announced that night. There are also scholarships that are given based on nominations by staff so we encourage all students to attend. Dress at Class Night for students is Cap and Gown. While long, it is certainly exciting to see whose hard work has paid off!

Graduation practice – Thursday, May 29th 6:00pm at Tommy Roberts Memorial Stadium

Graduation practice is **MANDATORY** for any student wishing to walk in Friday's graduation ceremony. It is held at 6:00pm at Tommy Roberts Stadium on Kennedy Dr. Please be on time. Dress is casual, but it is suggested that girls bring their shoes to ensure they can walk comfortably. You will receive an index card for you to phonetically write your name with how you want it announced as you walk across the stage. We will then practice how to walk to your seat and how to walk to receive your diploma and how to walk back to your seat once you have received your diploma.
