They are free checking accounts with Conch debit cards help raise money up to \$1,000 per month for Key West High School. Keys FCU donates:

\$5 to [KWHS for each account opened](#).

- \$2 to KWHS for each box of checks ordered.
- 1% of each account holder's debit card transactions, up to \$15 per month to KWHS during specific promotional periods like Back to School, Spring Break and Christmas season.

Conch Pride accounts include free adult and teen online & mobile financial education programs that teach them how to save and manage their checking account and credit history and more.

Who can get a Conch Pride Checking Account?

Conch Pride Checking Accounts and Debit Cards are perfect for KWHS students- 14 years and older, parents, teachers, staff, alumni, and fans-that live or work in the Florida Keys.

Where can you open a Conch Pride account?

How can KWHS raise more money?

- Identify promotional/sponsorship opportunities on school materials/areas
- Circulate donation photos and information

Keys FCU will create and provide all Conch Pride marketing materials. KWHS must distribute, hang, communicate, and publish them.



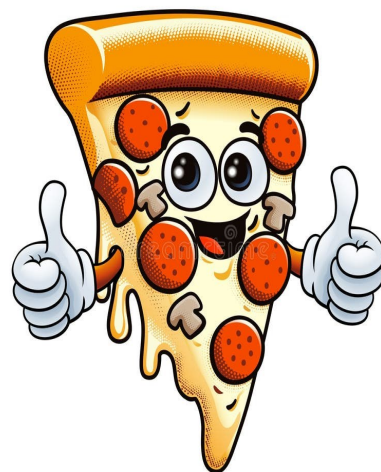

Essay Contest on the Importance of Civic Engagement Among Youth

About

Civic engagement among youth is crucial for the health and vitality of any society. When young people actively participate in their communities – whether through voting, volunteering or activism – they not only help address immediate issues, but also lay the foundation for long-term societal progress. Their involvement brings fresh ideas, challenges the status quo and helps to build a more inclusive and representative democracy. Supporting and encouraging civic engagement among young people can lead to more vibrant, equitable communities and a stronger, more resilient society.

Prompt

In 750 words or less, discuss the “Importance of Civic Engagement Among Youth” and the significance of young people participating in politics, community service and activism. Explore how increased civic engagement can influence societal change and the potential barriers that young people face.

Prize

1. First place winner will receive a \$1,500 scholarship to a Florida college or technical career institution of your choice and a resolution from the **Florida Black Caucus of Local Elected Officials** (FBC-LEO).
2. Second place winner will receive a \$500 scholarship to a Florida college or technical career institution of your choice and a resolution from FBC-LEO.
3. Third place winner will receive a \$250 scholarship to a Florida college or technical career institution of your choice and a resolution from FBC-LEO.

Entry Requirements and Instructions

You must be an eleventh or twelfth grader in an FBC-LEO member municipality during the 2024-2025 school year.

- The essay must be typed or legibly printed (no cursive and no pictures).
- The use of AI and ChatGPT software or similar programs is strictly prohibited.
- The essay must not exceed 750 words.
- A completed entry form must be returned with your essay.
- Previous winners may not apply.
- Submit your entry by **December 6, 2024, by 5:00 p.m. ET** at fbcleo.org/essay-contest.
- Essays received after the deadline will not be considered.
