Threat Update

Boy was brought to the Keys. Passports were taken away from the family. Bus issue from 2/13 was handled with the help of the teachers and parents. Mr. Pais will get more information regarding buses at a later date. Mr. Pais met with DOT and they're going to come and conduct a survey. Consideration of a NO U TURN sign up in the median near Sheriff car (by the DOT.) It was also discussed a possibility of putting a RIGHT TURN ONLY sign to exit school.
