

SAC Meeting Agenda August 23, 2017 Media Center 5:30pm

Mr. Unke, Principal, called the meeting to order at 5:35. He welcomed parents and teachers.

1. Introduction of new staff members

2. Election of new officers (President, VP and Secretary)

Mr. Unke requested volunteers to serve as SAC officers. He explained that these officers would attend meetings to discuss school business and voting to approve SIP and other initiatives. Elected into office were: President: Teresa Yeider VP: Mandy Lee Secretary: Maggi Huff

3. Construction Update

Mr. Unke gave a construction update. He stated the current building which houses grades 3-5 will be demolished and a new buildings will replace it. Portables for grades 3-5 and existing classes in the Switlik building will go up in the front field in May. The

construction project is expected to take two years, with an expected completion date of Fall 2020. The construction project will include two buildings, a dock for science lessons while maintaining two front fields and the back field.

4. Campus Security

Mr. Unke stated that a lot of effort has been put into campus security. Starting this year there are several new security procedures. Gates at both ends of campus will be locked each evening. Gate closest to bus loop will re-open at 8:00 am and will be locked again at 8:30 am. Parents and students getting to school after 8:30 am will have to go thru the front office. Students are not allowed on campus before 7:30 am. Morning programs are underway in the Media center and Sue Moore Lab. Mr. Unke stressed the importance of using drop off loop with safety patrols and busses to alleviate traffic congestion. The Yacht Club has been very cooperative with overflow, but parents expressed concerns that Senior Center hasn't. Mr. Unke was very understanding of parents concerns, but explained there is no quick fix for parking issue (other than possibility of use of Jaycees during construction) and that parking is on the list of needs for new construction project.

5. School Grade

Mr. Unke announced Switlik's school grade went from a C to a B+ and that it was a tremendous effort by all. The superintendent recognized Switlik for improving all seven categories.

6. Calendar Review
