#### New Website

The new district and KLS website is to go live on February 28th..We will be getting a new website (all schools). If you notice anything missing, please let an administrator know and we will notify the webmaster. It will be new for everything.

AVID Update—we are currently scoring ourselves across the school and checking our growth in WICOR strategies. We had a two year grace period which is currently ending. We were recognized as a School Demonstration School and our expectations are still similar. Tutors are needed (current college students of any age).

AVID elective is looking at field trips, the color run, and career day.

Testing Windows Writing will be in April and the remaining tests will be in May. The schedule will be published once the district approves it.

#### School Safety and Security

We continue to have new cameras installed.

A new fire alarm and PA system are scheduled to be installed this summer.

This means the summer programs may be hosted at PKS.

#### 50th Anniversary update

The ceremony is tomorrow. The teachers and students have been working VERY hard to prepare for this. Everyone got to contribute to the time capsule. Each class will send two representatives to the 'live' ceremony. This ceremony is for the teachers and staff who impacted KLS. The carnival is to celebrate the students and families. There is a timeline with baby pictures. There is a list of fun facts.

The carnival was moved to March 5th due to COVID concerns. 1-7 pm at Rowell's Marina pending approval. PTA is asking to have the fees waived (\$1 per person up to \$1000)

## COVID Update

KLS was hit hard

Break: 9 students, 8 teachers, and 4 staff

The week we returned: 25 students, 11 teachers, and 7 staff

So far this week: 24 students, 5 teachers, and 3 staff

Our previous high was 6 students on week 4 & on week 7 we had 1 staff and 1 teacher

We continue to spray the door handles and high traffic areas.

Custodians have been hit hard as well. We expect them to clean high traffic areas and not to worry about some of the other areas.

Alanna complimented the teachers here and at CSH for making sure work is provided for students who are quarantined. We grade mastery, not time so this is important for teachers and students.

## Budget projection

The district has started the budgeting process. I was given a forecast form to start working on.

We have a final student count the week of February 7th. We need every student to come to school that week so we can get the count correct.

Right now the budget looks good for KLS. We don't want the projection to differ from enrollment by too much (18 students is one teacher unit).

## Mid-year SIP Update

Administration and academic coaches are meeting on Friday morning to go over data.

We will have another update next month.

Preliminary data shows growth in all grades. ONLY 65 reading deficiency letters were signed out of 726.

\*Scheduling—A team will look at a new type of middle school schedule. A flex period is an option that would give students some choice to explore other subjects.

The Upper Keys meeting will be on February 16th at CSHS.

## FLASH Curriculum

Comprehensive Health Education is required instruction per Florida State statute 1003.42(2)(n). The curriculum includes 13 components of health that are age and developmentally-appropriate.

The topics are consumer health, community health, environmental health, mental and emotional health, injury prevention and safety, internet safety, nutrition, personal health, prevention and control of disease, substance use and abuse, and prevention of child sexual abuse, exploitation, and human trafficking. Human growth and development, including puberty and sexual health education, is an integral part of these components.

The Monroe County School District acknowledges that parents/guardians are the primary sexuality educators for their child(ren) and we are committed to partnering with you to provide supplementary resources to support you in this role.
